CITY OF DAYTON SERVICES

BULKY WASTE PICK-UP

The City of Dayton provides four bulk-waste pick-ups a year at no cost. Bulk waste pick-ups must be scheduled in advance by calling 333-4800.

Residents can call between new expanded hours of 7:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m.

Bulk waste items are to be set out after 3:00 p.m. of the day *before* the scheduled pick-up. City crews begin pick-ups at 7:00 a.m.

Bulk Waste Guidelines

- You must separate your metal items (stoves, refrigerators, etc.) from other bulk items. Remember to remove refrigerator doors.
 - All loose and small items must be securely contained, bundled or bagged for easy pickup.
 - Sorry, the City cannot pick up concrete, rocks, brick blocks, sand, gravel, or hazardous waste.
 - Yard waste (brush, hedges, tree limbs, etc.) must be tied into bundles not larger than 4 feet long and 18 inches in diameter.
 - Bundles are limited to 25 pounds each.
 - Remember, the City *cannot* pickup grass clippings.

Waste Collection Do's and Don'ts:

- Do have your rollout container or bulk items out by 7:00 a.m.
- Do keep bulk and metal items separated (they're picked up by a separate truck).
- Do place the recycling container or any other items at least 5 feet from your rollout container.
- Do keep yard waste separated from other collection items (it also must be cut and tied in 4-foot lengths no larger than 18 inches in diameter).
- Do not leave rollout at curb or alley after collection.
- Do not overfill rollout (lid should be closed on rollout).
- Do not place any hot items in rollout (e.g., ashes from fireplace).
- Do not place rollout close to any obstruction (such as an automobile).
- Do not put loose trash in rollout (wrap or bag all trash).
- Do not have trash piled on or around rollout.

HOME FORECLOSURE ASSISTANCE

Dayton City Commissioner Dean Lovelace urges Dayton residents who feel they may be the victim of predatory lending practices to seek help through various community agencies.

Dayton ranked 16th among the 100 largest metropolitan areas in the United States for home foreclosures during the first half of 2007. Many of these foreclosures can be attributed to predatory lending practices.

"Predatory lending continues to be a serious issue, not just in Dayton, but across the country," Commissioner Lovelace said. "I urge anyone who is in danger of losing their mortgage to contact one of the agencies below for help and advice."

Loans for Emergency Home Repairs – Dayton Fund for Home Rehabilitation

Provides no-interest loans for emergency repairs for owner-occupied homes, wheelchair ramp construction, minor bathroom modifications for persons in wheelchairs, air conditioners for homeowners with a medical necessity (must have doctor's order specifying disease/condition). Loans must be secured by a mortgage and are generally limited to a maximum of \$5,000. Repayments are determined by the homeowner's ability to pay. Grants for small amounts (usually under \$100) are available when there is little ability to repay.
